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
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
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Spring had sprung on the ranch and all was green and bright. Flowers were blooming and butterflies were fluttering here and there from flower to flower and tree to tree.




"But I thought we were going on an expedition," said Sam.

Write about everything you discover and learn. Draw pictures of everything you see.

If you find a plant that is of interest to you, collect it and put into a plant press.

A plant press is a set of equipment used to flatten and dry plant samples so that they can be easily stored. You can find lots of different examples by searching in Google and the library on how to make your own plant press.

Your plant and flower specimens prepared in a plant press can later be glued to archival- quality card stock with their labels, and then filed in a herbarium.

I invite you to explore and discover what is:

- 1) Archival quality card stock, and
- 2) What is an 'herbarium'?

It is very easy to make a plant press at home with newspaper and cardboard left around the house.

All you have to do is this.

- 1) Place a couple of pieces of newspaper on top of cardboard.
- 2) Place your collected plants to be pressed on top of the newspaper. Take time to position the plant as you wish for them to be pressed. Once they are dry they will be brittle.
- 3) Wrap a belt or string tight around the cardboard to keep the plant press flat. Place something heavy like a book on top of the plant press to keep it flat and pressed against the plants.

Now you have your own plant collection.

Remember, any time you have questions about your expedition what do you do?

That is correct!!!

You ask someone to help you.


